The Five Love Languages

- Words of Affirmation
- Gifts
- Acts of Service
- Time
- Physical



Words of Affirmation

- “Using words that buildup”
- Verbal compliments, words of appreciation
- Proclamation of love

Giving of Gifts

- Giving a gift without expecting a gift
- Gift is a visible symbol of love
- Can have cost associated with it or not

Acts of Service

- Express your love by doing things for them
- Seeking to please someone by serving them and doing what they would like you to do for them

Quality Time

- “Be with” the other
- Spend time away from distraction with them

Physical Touch

- Physically contacting or connecting with them
- Hugging, kissing, patting, caressing, high fiving, holding hands, sitting close to
